

A Message on Manasseh

(II Chronicles 33:1-20)

Hezekiah served his God and turned his people to the Lord;
They destroyed the heathen altars that Almighty God abhorred.
They resumed the Temple worship as instructed all along,

But Manasseh did not follow in his father's godly way.
He put idols in the Temple that would lead the folks astray,
